

ILLINOIS TECH FAST FACTS

Illinois Institute of Technology, also known as **Illinois Tech**, is a private, technology-focused, research university offering undergraduate and graduate degrees in engineering, science, architecture, business, design, human sciences, applied technology, and law.

SIZE AND STATS

— 120-acre Mies Campus

- Four square city blocks between 31st and 35th streets, Michigan Avenue, and the Dan Ryan Expressway
- Easily accessible by the Dan Ryan Expressway, the Red and Green Line “L” trains, various Chicago Transit Authority buses, and the Metra Rock Island line (35th Street/“Lou” Jones/Bronzeville stop)

— 2016 Undergraduate Enrollment: 2,944

- Approximately 500 first-year students and 250 transfer students per entering class
- 35% female
- Majority of undergraduate and graduate students are from Illinois, with students from all 50 states and 100 countries (26% of undergraduate students are international)

ACADEMICS

— 2014–15 Degrees Awarded, Undergraduate (approximate)

- 50% engineering
- 20% architecture (five-year B.Arch.)
- 30% in business, psychology, computer science, applied mathematics, biology, chemistry, physics, humanities, communication, other

— Why Study at Illinois Tech?

- Hands-on, project-based, relevant education
- Small class sizes, personal attention—13:1 student-to-faculty ratio
- Introduction to the Profession (ITP) courses introduce students to the specific scope of their intended area of study
- Interprofessional Projects (IPRO) Program provides students with hands-on experience working in teams to solve real-world problems
- Idea Shop offers rapid-prototyping equipment, 3-D printers, and team workspace

APPLYING TO ILLINOIS TECH

— Two Types of Admission Deadlines: Priority and Rolling

- Emphasize importance of deadlines for scholarship consideration

— Must submit application, essay, high school transcript, letter of recommendation, and ACT/SAT scores

— Average entering GPA for first-years students: 3.7–4.37/4.0

— Recommended High School Coursework

- Four years of English
- Four years of mathematics
- Four years of science

— Typical test scores for admitted students: Mid-50% ACT: 25–31, SAT 1240–1410

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

— Tuition: \$44,150

- Room and board: \$11,840 average (typical for incoming student depending on residence hall, room type, and meal plan)
- Fees: \$1,714 (approximately)

— About 97% of Illinois Tech students receive some form of need-based or merit-based aid

- Merit-Based Scholarships
 - Camras Scholarship (full tuition)
 - Leadership Academy Scholarship (full tuition)
 - Crown Scholarship (full-time architecture applicants only)
 - Duchossois Leadership Scholars Program (full tuition, room and board, and fees)
- Need-Based Aid (dependent on a FAFSA or Financial Aid Review)
 - Institutional grants
 - State and federal grants
 - Federal Work Study
 - Federal loan programs
